CRITERIA FOR MCKC AGILITY DOG OF THE YEAR

MCKC Agility Dog of the Year will be determined by the three best AKC runs in Standard and Jumpers (6 runs total) during the given year.

It will be up to the member to select their 3 best runs in standard and jumpers. The member must complete the award form and submit copies of their qualifying ribbon labels or print the results from the AKC web site and submit them to the awards chairperson.

To print your results, go to www.akc.org; click Events, then click Event Calendar. Click on the Event Search tab. Select Agility Trials for the competition type from the drop-down list. Choose the relevant Time Range from the drop-down. Click on the state the trial was in. Click the orange Search button. Scroll to find the date and trial. Click on the club name. Click on the appropriate class and jump height to find the time for your dog. Print the page. Include the standard course time (SCT) below when filling out the form. Subtract your course time from the SCT and put this number in the Time under SCT column below.

The MCKC Agility Dog of the Year will be determined first by the best average score (points). If there is a tie for high average points then the high average time under SCT will determine the Agility Dog of the Year.

Attach your ribbon label copies or AKC result printouts to this form and submit to the awards chairperson by the required date.
